Minutes of the Board of Trustees Meeting

May 26, 2022

Pursuant to due notice thereof, a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of Tri-County Electric Cooperative, Inc. (hereinafter called the "Cooperative") was held on May 26, 2022 at the Headquarters Office in St. Matthews, South Carolina. In order to comply with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's guidance of social distancing due to the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreaks, the meeting took place in the Auditorium.

Shaw. Also present were Chad T. Lowder, CEO, John G. Felder, Sr., General Counsel, Michael Weeks, VP of Finance and Administration, Keith Scharf, VP of Safety and Loss Control, Wilford Thompson, VP of Member Services and Government Relations, and Cindy Sarratt, who recorded the minutes of the meeting.

## **CALL TO ORDER – INVOCATION**

The meeting was called to order by President Barbara F. Weston at 6:00 p.m. Following the Call to Order, Joe Strickland gave the Invocation.

# MEMBER COMMENT PERIOD

There were no members present or online during the Member Comment Period.

### **EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES**

The CEO distributed a copy of *Empowering Communities, How Electric Cooperatives Transformed South Carolina*, written by Lacy K. Ford, professor of history at the University of South Carolina, and Jared Bailey. The book chronicles the beginnings, growth, and important contributions of electric cooperatives in South Carolina.

The System Summary Reports and Monthly Financial Statements for April 2022 were approved as presented by the CEO.

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## **NEW MEMBER REPORT**

The CEO reported that 106 new members made application for service in April 2022 and those new members are now actively receiving electric service from the Cooperative.

There were 147 Final Bills sent out for the month of April. Those members are no longer receiving electric service from the Cooperative.

### **SAFETY REPORT**

The CEO reported that there were no lost time accidents, no hours lost, no OSHA recordable accidents, no employee injuries, and no consumer damage claims filed in April 2022. One vehicle accident occurred when an employee was backing a vehicle while doing right-of-way work during a storm. The fence was cut in two places at the Santee Office.

Barbara Weston reported that adjustments were made on a few expense reports due to the fact that two meetings were held on the same day (April 20, 2022) and three board members were inadvertently paid two per diems for that day. ## MID-YEAR COST OF LIVING EVALUATION AND ADJUSTMENT PROPOSAL
